Recent Events

- Main Pass IV has secured and commenced in December 2024 a new 2-year contract in Nigeria.
- Shelf Drilling Scepter secured a 1-year extension with Chevron in Nigeria by option exercise.
- Trident 16 has secured and commenced in February 2025 a new 3-month contract with Petrobel in Egypt.
- The Company has terminated the contracts of Shelf Drilling Victory and High Island II with Saudi Aramco.
- High Island II has secured a new one well (~45 days) contract in Nigeria for expected commencement in April 2025, and will be mobilized with Shelf Drilling Victory to West Africa for upcoming contract opportunities.
- Shelf Drilling Barsk commenced a contract with Equinor in Norway in November 2024.
- J.T. Angel and Parameswara have completed their previous ONGC contracts in India in November 2024 and January 2025, respectively, while Trident XII is expected to complete its ONGC contract in early March 2025.
- Sale of the Main Pass I for \$11 million was completed in January 2025.
- Trident VIII has been mobilized to the UAE. Rig sale for recycling is expected to be completed no later than April 2025.
